## FIRST AND FOREMOST...

The City of Elk Grove's main objective is to provide, maintain and operate adequate flood control facilities to ensure public safety, property protection and quality of life to our residents and businesses while preserving the natural environment;

The City currently has policies, procedures and standards in place to require new development to comply with the above objective;

The Flood Control and Storm Drainage Master Plan (SDMP) will provide the City a broader sense of the necessary facilities required to meet the above objective.



In addition to the City of Elk Grove's main objective, the City has an agreement with the Stone Lakes National Wildlife Refuge Association et al. to perform the following:

1. Host quarterly workshops to address drainage issues associated with existing conditions and planned growth within the City on the Stone Lakes National Wildlife Refuge and nearby areas up until the time a Storm Drainage Master Plan is adopted;
2. Prepare an Environmental Impact Report (EIR) to satisfy the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) for approval of the SDMP.
